GRADUATE STUDENT SYMPOSIUM

CALL FOR PAPERS

AI 2008, the twenty-first Canadian Conference on Artificial Intelligence, invites graduate students to submit extended abstracts of up to two pages for possible inclusion in the AI 2008 Graduate Student Symposium. The symposium will be a half-day pre-conference event, where students of accepted abstracts will be invited to give a short presentation before a group of their peers as well as other interested attendees. A small team of expert AI researchers will be on hand to offer a critique of each presentation, and provide support, advice and mentoring. Each student will also be invited to participate in the poster session during the main conference. In addition, a small selection of the best student submissions will be invited to give a short talk during the main conference.

Students are invited to submit original, unpublished work in all areas of Artificial Intelligence. It is not expected that submissions will consist of polished work with complete results; instead, more weight will be placed on the significance of the work, the proposed ideas or solutions, and the overall presentation. Submissions should therefore have emphasis on work in progress, with directions for future research clearly indicated wherever appropriate.

Each paper will be reviewed by a mixed team of both students and program committee members. Submissions must be no more than 2 pages long, and must conform to the formatting instructions of the Lecture Notes in

Artificial Intelligence series by Springer. Note that the submitting student must register for the full conference in order to participate in the symposium. A letter from the student's supervisor must accompany the submission, attesting to the student's full time status. Partial financial assistance for travel and accommodations may be available to a limited number of students enrolled in the symposium.
